

What Your Teen Needs To Know Before They Fly the Coop

Is it just me, or are the days and weeks accelerating? Only yesterday, the kids were in diapers, drooling on my shoulder. Now they are getting driver's licenses and planning their 401K's. Well, nearly. I can't go too in-depth here, but I want to provide a quick overview of what your teen needs to know before they leave your home so that you have a tangible goal and feel empowered to meet it.

1. God is real.

Knowing this will make all the difference in the world as to how your teen will live their life.

2. You Are Valuable.

Doubting one's inherent worth is one of the primary reasons teens get off course. If they don't know they are children of God, they will spend their lives searching for identity and fulfillment in the earthly.



3. Soul Over Status

Social media is extremely alluring *and* addictive. The draw of seeking followers over authentic friendships can overwhelm both teens and adults. With the image of perfectly polished influencers streaming into their minds, it can be tempting for teens to prioritize their image over the cultivation of a holy soul.

4. Earthly Choices Have Eternal Consequences

Hell is real. So is heaven. Where we end up is up to us. Implore your teen to choose wisely.

5. Struggle ≠ Failure

To struggle against a sin is not a sin itself. To struggle means you haven't given in. "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." John 16:33 To struggle is normal. Teach your teen to expect difficulties so they are not shaken when they occur.

6. God is a Loving Father

No matter how great our fathers are on this earth, we may still have difficulty believing that God could love us as a perfect father, especially when we are so broken and imperfect. But it's true. God loves us as his children despite our imperfections. He desires what is good for us. And He can be trusted.

7. "Follow Your Heart" is a Pathway to Pain

The heart is a fickle thing; if we let it, we will follow the happy road to destruction. Truthfully, teenagers’ brains are not yet fully developed and the concept that now isn’t all there will ever be can be difficult for teens to embrace. 12. JOY = Jesus First, Others Next, *then* Yourself

Faith-filled Fiction:








Are DEMONS and ANGELS, like vampires and werewolves, merely legend and lore? Or is there more to life than meets the eye?
